SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS



Dear Friends,

To mark the 100th anniversary of the first Glasgow Start of the Monte Carlo Rallye from Blythswood Square we are pleased to announce this very special Classic Car event, The Anniversary Monte 100 Touristique. From Glasgow we shall drive to the Principality of Monaco following in the tracks of the old Montes, taking in many of the famous Cols and Passes in the French Alps. Like the Montes of old the goal is simply to reach Monte Carlo in time for the party!

The Touristique will depart from Blythswood Square Gardens on the morning of Wednesday 31 January 2024, and follow the Rallye Monte Carlo Historique competitors to Dover, visiting their Passage Controls en route. For those living in the south of England, there may be the opportunity for entrants to 'join in' with the Glasgow starters, if there is enough demand. See entry form. After crossing the Channel there is an overnight halt in a charming chateau outside Calais.

On day 2, Thursday 1 February, setting out from Calais, we shall visit the scrutineering venue for the Reims starters and then carry on to Langres for our second overnight halt. Day 3, Friday 2 February, our route takes us from Langres to Gap following traditional Monte roads. The next day, Saturday 3 February, we come down from the Alps to the warmth of the winter sunshine in Monte Carlo. In the evening a glittering black tie Gala Dinner and prize giving will be held in the Automobile Club de Monaco. The following day, Sunday 4 February, you will have an opportunity to take part in a traditional Mountain Circuit, finishing at the top of the Col de Turini in time for lunch. No overnight driving is involved in this event. The event is open to pre-war cars from 1924 to 1939 and post war cars from 1948 to 1982.

The entry fee will include two nights for two people with breakfast in the five star Fairmont Hotel, Monaco, one night for two people at the Chateau de Cocove, Calais, two tickets for the gala dinner and prize-giving in the Automobile Club de Monaco, a route book, rally plates, souvenirs, gifts etc. Information about booking the suggested hotels in Langres and Gap will follow.

We would like to thank the Automobile Club de Monaco for their help and support in making this event possible. The team look forward to welcoming you to Glasgow, where your Monte adventure begins .

TUESDAY 30 JANUARY 2024 Document checks and Scrutineering

Document checks and Scrutineering will take place at Waterside Classics, Govan, Glasgow. Details of scrutineering and signing on will be sent out with the Final Instructions. You will be required to present the following documents: your vehicle's registration document (V5C), driving licences of driver and co-driver, proof of insurance including cover for driving in Europe. Mandatory items for a vehicle and driver in France are a warning triangle; headlight beam deflectors, reflective jackets, breathalysers, first aid kit, and a UK sticker, spare light bulb kit. It is suggested that you visit the AA or RAC websites for the most up to date advice. Drive-France.com describes fully the requirements and especially the need for a Crit Air Sticker and how to obtain one. Information on Crit Air Stickers on entry form.

You will also require a passport which is valid for at least three months after your departure date. If your insurance does not include overseas vehicle recovery it is advisable to take out this type of cover. This event can be described as a motor touring holiday. It is not a competitive rally.

On the same day there will be the option to take part in a manoeuvrability test, concours d'elegance and comfort competition. These were part of the early Monte Carlo Rallies. There will be a pre-rally dinner in the evening.

Note: Calais to Rheims via Autoroute to visit the Historique scrutineering venue at Parc des Expositions de Rheims in Courmontreuil. The route will then use a commonly used Historique route to Langres well ahead of the competitors in the Rallye Monte Carlo Historique.



III ORGANISATION

The Anniversary Monte 100 Touristique is a touring event organised by the Ecosse Rallye Drivers Club and the Monte Start Committee Scotland. There is no timing on the road and it is strictly non-competitive. The only fixed time is your start time in Glasgow, other times are for guidance. UK section run under a certificate of exemption issued by Motorsport UK.

IV ELIGIBLE CARS

Cars must be road legal and similar to the type of model which took part in the Monte Carlo Rallies between 1948 and 1982. Pre-war cars of any type from 1924 to 1939 are eligible to enter this event. No historic technical passport is required for either category.

V ELIGIBLE CREWS

Crews must consist of one driver and one co-driver, each holding a valid driving licence and covered by insurance for the entire event in the UK and in France.

VI DRIVING STANDARDS

Please drive at all times with due consideration, in particular in the towns and villages. Please abide by all speed limits and warning signs, particularly on 'unprotected' crossroads shown as an 'X' on the warning sign. You do not have the right of way and it is 'priorité à droit', ie vehicles entering the junction on your right have priority even if it appears to be a side road.

Most French towns and villages have speed humps to manage traffic. They are not always indicated by a sign so please be alert in order to avoid damage to your car. Most speed cameras are identified by a sign alongside, but random mobile checks are carried out also and any fine issued has to be paid on the spot.







VII ROUTE AND NAVIGATION

The route will be sent out in advance in Monte Carlo Rallye style so that you can plot it onto your road map. Suggested maps: For the route from Glasgow to Dover Phillips Navigator Road Atlas (Spiral bound); From Calais to Monaco Michelin 1:200000 France Road Atlas (Spiral bound); For Turini Tour and area around Monaco IGN1/25000 "TOP25" maps ET3741 and ET3743. All are available online from The Map Shop, Upton on Severn. It is a suggested route and you are free to choose a different route should you be held up by unforeseen circumstances. Each morning there will be a driver's briefing with updates on the weather etc.

You will receive a route book which will include the Historique Passage Controls in the UK. The route book will also identify landmarks to look out for en route through France if you decide to follow the suggested route.
